

ALAS Leaders in Education Awards Nominee LATINO SUPERINTENDENT OF THE YEAR

Name: Dr. David Negron

Occupation: Superintendent of Maywood-Melrose Park-Broadview School District 89



Dr. David A. Negron is the proud superintendent of Maywood-Melrose Park-Broadview School District 89. He has over 17 years of experience in public education. He has been a public school administrator for 13 years serving as an elementary principal, middle school principal and now as a superintendent. Dr. Negron started his career as a school social worker and a bilingual teacher. Dr. Negron believes strongly that all students can learn and learn at high levels. He further believes in developing strong professional learning communities where teachers and staff members can continue to develop their craft and master new skills.

Dr. Negron is an elected official serving as a school board member at his children's school district for the past four years. Dr. Negron received an Educator of the Year award in 2012 and an Ambassador for Educational Excellence in 2012 from Schaumburg School District 54. Additionally, he was recognized in 2007 by Northeastern Illinois University with an Educational Leadership award for his work with students. 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BOARD ELECTIONS

Elections for the positions of Vice President, Secretary I and Historian will be held from April 20, 2018 through May 11, 2018. Below are the roles and responsibilities for these positions. **Nominations will be opened until April 16, 2018**.

Vice President: The vice president shall serve as presidentelect and preside in the absence of the president and perform all duties as assigned by the president. In this capacity, the vice president shall represent IALAS as the office dictates.

Secretary: The secretary shall share the responsibility of keeping the minutes of all regular and special IALAS meetings. The secretary shall promptly transmit to each member the minutes of such meetings and see that all notices of meetings and other IALAS events are duly given in accordance with the provisions of the bylaws. The secretary shall maintain the register of membership inclusive of names, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses. The secretary shall perform duties as assigned. In the absence of the secretary, the president will appoint a member to take minutes.

Historian/Publicist: The historian/publicist shall maintain the history as well as the archives of IALAS. As publicist, this officer also shall have oversight of the IALAS website and communicate with the membership, public and media using a variety of tools including email and social media.
